

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Complete an application form obtained upon request from your school or by downloading it from www.julesguesde.fr and submit it to the school no later than the date indicated on the high school's web site

Convocations will be sent to families by mail

Aptitude tests at Jules Guesde:

- **Written** test: 2hours on a Wednesday afternoon
- **Oral** test : 20minutes in May

The tests allow to assess the capacity of French- speaking students to follow lessons dispensed in English

ADMISSION RESULTS

After taking into consideration the students' school reports and test results, the Principal establishes a list of accepted candidates which he submits to the Inspector of the Academy.

Results are sent by mail.

ADVANTAGES OF THE AMERICAN SECTION

- Allies French curriculum and foreign curricula
- Allows students regular practice of the **English language**, study of **Anglo-American literature** and a deepening of their knowledge of American **history, geography** and **culture**
- Confirms a **highly advanced level of language skills** when validated by the **Baccalaureate**
- Favours the pursuit of **studies abroad**

SUITABLE STUDENT PROFILE

- English-speakers of all nationalities
- Bi-national or bilingual English-speakers
- French students with a **high level of English**
- All candidates should possess a **strong motivation to study literary works in English**

LANGUAGE CONTENT

Weekly schedule :

- 2^{nde} : 3 hours of English
- 1^{ère} : 2,5 hours of English
- T^{le} : 2 hours of English

NB: English-speaking or bilingual students may be exempted from English lessons to take advantage of a supplementary course in French in order to facilitate their integration into the French school system



- **4** hours of **Anglo-American literature** dispensed **in English** by a teacher who is an English native speaker
- **4** hours of **History - Geography** dispensed in **English and/or French (on a 2 + 2 hour basis)**

L'OPTION OIB AU BACCALAURÉAT

The exams :

Students enrolled in an **international section** sit the **same exams** as their classmates with the same options. However they take **specific exams** in **Anglo- American literature** and in **History - Geography**.



Anglo-American Literature exams

- **Written** composition in English

Duration: **4** hours, Coefficient: 10

- **Oral** literary commentary in English

Duration: **30** minutes, Coefficient: 5

History-Geography exams

- **Written** composition in English

Duration: **4** hours, Coefficient : 10

- **Oral** interrogation in English

Duration: 20min, Coefficient 5

N.B. The OIB has a total weight (“coefficient”) of 130 compared to 100 for the standard general Baccalaureate.
